

COMMUNITY ACTION PROJECT CONTEST

OVERVIEW

The Community Action Project contest evaluates a team of two contestants' ability to develop, execute, document and present a project that was completed in their community or school and which provides a benefit or learning experience to the community or school. This event also enables the community to become aware of the outstanding work being performed by career and technical education students.

THE CONTEST

- The contest requires the contestants to develop and execute a project in the community or school community.
- The contest will consist of two parts: an electronic notebook outlining the
 community service project and a live presentation by two eligible contestants
 explaining the project. Team members will have five to ten minutes to present to
 a panel of judges. The presentation will be conducted virtually for a panel of
 judges. Refer to contest guidelines for specific requirements. (See Technical
 Standards)
- Contestants must create a one-page résumé and submit via electronic upload.
 Failure to do so will result in a 10-point penalty.

CONTEST SUBMISSION PROCEDURES

- Contest items must be submitted electronically through the contest submission form. Notebook in PDF format should be included.
- Contestants will receive a specified date/time and login credentials to participate
 in the virtual portion of the contest via electronic platform with a panel of judges.
 Contestants should be dressed in professional business attire or SkillsUSA attire
 for this session.

DEADLINE

All contest items must be received by Tuesday, February 15, 2022, through the contest submission form.
